He is negotiating the ferry fare from Sandspit which will probably be around \$100 return .



A BIG GRUMBLE

Our Thickness Sander was trashed last week!. Members were most upset to find the sanding drum caked in paint? and the conveyor belt destroyed! Not only could our members not use it, but we discovered repairs would cost in excess of \$300 and parts would have to come by slow boat from Taiwan, so it will be out of commission for perhaps months!

A Notice to ALL MEMBERS. Keep an eye out for people abusing our gear!

Show them how to use it correctly, or notify the Duty Manager who can refuse them access to the machine.

For the record, the thickness sander is only for <u>fine finish sanding</u>. Its <u>not a BELT SANDER!</u> Only advance the control wheel a quarter of a turn, Maximum, per pass and use a sacrificial board with double sided tape under your work to make sure the sanding belt doesnt destroy the conveyor belt!

Members have been charged for repairs in the past and may be again in the future.

Our hard working crew now have to spend many hours earning the money to pay for repairs!
