

# Projects Abodo DOC200s Shipped!!





This has been our biggest environmental order and has proven fairly challenging. The customer wanted these 100 mustelid traps specifically made using their product and installed in their supplier's forest in Hawkes Bay. We had to take extra care laminating the boards together and avoiding splitting the timber especially on the lids where we traditionally use plywood. The treatment used by Abodo Wood Ltd is commercially sensitive so we're hoping the long-term performance in the forest will be OK.
