Some Innovative Environmental Projects



Special mesh ends for "Glue Boxes" on Hauraki Gulf ferries. We have previously made these boxes to a specification from Sealink and Fullers. They are like a small rat tunnel except they have a very sticky pad in the bottom instead of the usual spring trap. The customers have asked for 200 steel mesh ends to replace the original core flute.

Rats have been found to be quite partial to core flute!

Special DOC200 mustelid traps for Pan Pac forest in Hawkes Bay. These are to be made with Pan Pac's timber having been strength & preservative treated by Abobo Wood Ltd. The Adobo dressed timber will be glue-laminated for the tunnel components. It is a case of the synergy of using a customer's product for predator control in the forest. The expected order will be for 100 of these DOC200s which will be stacked and strapped on to pallets for freighting to Hawkes Bay.

Mentor Recruitment...Big Brother...Big Sister

We are reaching out to different community groups to increase our mentor recruitment, with a specific target on East Auckland. I understand that Mens Shed Auckland East is a place that many older people go to in order to build relationships, do rewarding work, share their interests and give back to the community, which aligns exactly with the intention of mentoring. Our mentors come from all walks of life and all different ages and stages, and we find that often our best and longest lasting mentor matches are between young boys and older male mentors. Matches are nearly always gender matched (a young boy with an older male mentor for example), and the expectation from our mentors is that they meet with their 'mentee' once a week for around 1-2 hours, and continue this for a minimum of 12 months, ideally longer. Many of our young people come from adverse backgrounds, and they are all in need of someone who can be a positive role model to them and offer a one-on-one connection. See More HERE
