Another job travelling through the shed at present is the building of 5 compost bins for OT in Parnell.

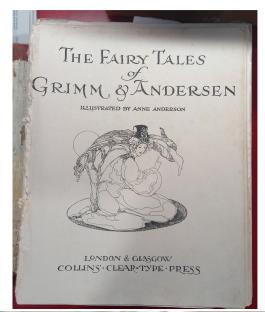
They each comprise 4 layers of frames which are stacked as the contents accumulate.

Then when their work is done the layers can be removed to release the rich compost.

Restoring a Classic:

Grimm & Andersen's Fairy Tales







Our bookbinding department is currently repairing a remarkable volume from the local library archives —

A book almost 100mm thick containing a combined collection of *Grimm's Fairy Tales* and *Andersen's Fairy Tales*.

The restoration process involves carefully removing the damaged cover, reinforcing fragile pages with fine paper supports, and rebuilding the binding to ensure this treasured work is preserved for future generations.

About the Authors and Their Tales

The Brothers Grimm – Jacob and Wilhelm Grimm of Germany published their first collection in 1812, drawn mainly from oral storytelling traditions. Their goal was to preserve authentic German folklore, and while early editions were dark and moralistic, later versions were softened for children. Famous tales include *Cinderella, Snow White, Hansel and Gretel, Rumpelstiltskin,* and *Rapunzel*.

Hans Christian Andersen – The Danish poet and writer began publishing his own literary fairy tales in 1835. Unlike the Grimms, Andersen created original stories, often infused with whimsy, melancholy, and moral lessons. His best-loved tales include *The Little Mermaid, The Ugly Duckling, The Snow Queen,* and *The Emperor's New Clothes*.

Two Traditions, One Legacy

While the Grimms preserved folklore and Andersen crafted original stories, together they shaped the backbone of Western fairy-tale tradition. Their works have inspired countless adaptations in literature, theatre, and film — and continue to enchant readers worldwide.

This restored volume will not only preserve their legacy but also allow future generations to enjoy the magic of these timeless stories.

More books await their time at the hands of our skilled members who exercise extreme patience and can spend the time to restore these collectible books to usable condition.
