Rat Central is on Lotte's front lawn at Medland's Beach and is where the Aotea Trap Library stores its trap boxes before a new trap line is initiated.

Lotte is enthusiastic about the gift of the dual "Mk6 Allan" trap box
as it means two potential catches per site
which is great news on the sand dunes as often mice get to the bait first
so a "second bite"should work for a slow rat.

Another feature is that the mesh is stapled to the frame so that pesky pukekos cannot lift out the gate of the single design

and get to the bait (or the kill!)

Lotte also commended the quality of construction of her dual "Mk6 Allan" and was even more impressed

when told that the item was made out of off-cuts.

"The mesh is exceptionally well cut" she was heard to say.

All in all, a grand exercise and one that we hope keeps our customers and us controlling pests into the future.


