The Story of the Slabs!



Members may have noticed several pallet loads of wooden slabs appear in the yard last week. Alan Minson tells us the history.

The kauri and totara came from freshly cut local trees in 2024 and are donations of rare native timber to the Shed. The trunk logs were stored alongside the eastern retaining wall. Dene H has a colleague with a small bandsaw mill at Karaka. Over the last few weeks Dene and John E have taken our logs out to Karaka and brought the slabs back. A pile of filletted freshly cut slabs is growing alongside the barn apron. The drying process is expected to take around 6 months.

We have invested in the logs collection, storage, delivery and gratuity to the mill owner. The slabs are considered a high-value asset and if used for projects the published charge-out schedule will apply.

To boost Shed funds, some of the slabs may be sold.

Our storage space is limited for bulk resources so thanks to all involved in this exercise from tree to slab.
