With the new canopy completed progress now turns to the new storage shed and concrete plinth for the dust extraction unit. To make the best use of resources, removal of some top soil will take place to prepare for the storage building and mechanical workshop extensions as stages 3 & 4 of the extension projects.

Hayden Paddon - the forgotten champion



Hayden is New Zealand's most successful rally driver both nationally and internationally, winning 1 WRC (World Rally Championship) rally, 2 x European Rally Championships, 8 WRC podiums, and more than 40 WRC stage victories. He was the 2011 Production World Rally Champion, becoming the first person in the Southern Hemisphere to ever win a world rally championship. He's also a 7-time New Zealand Rally Champion and has received many other national accolades. And he has just won the 2025 Australian rally championship.

Click the image to watch Hayden in action at the Otago Rally earlier this year, with co-driver John Kennard reading the pace notes. These notes are guiding Hayden through the course, telling him what's coming next. The ability to decode instructions like "Sixty left five minus over crest opens over 60 tightens four plus into triple caution right four over big jump off camber" is part of the reason why Hayden's our most successful rally driver.
