Members, who pondered on how to increase workshop space, decided to install a mezzanine floor.

This new space, created using the air space in the existing building, is an innovative solution to our ever growing membership.

This will be used for creative craft-type activities. Located above the existing woodwork shop is an engineered, interlocking, flooring system supported by laminated portal frames. It connects to our existing mezzanine, almost quadrupling the available space.

The name board had to be made to match the Rimu finish of the church foyer and involved much searching for suitable materials. Then fine cutting and fitting so the name tags "snapped" securely into position. Then color matching all the components to work in with other fine woodwork in the Church.
