Trees For Survival Project

Trees for Survival is an environmental education programme which involves young people growing and planting native trees to restore natural habitats by helping landowners revegetate erosion prone land, improve stream flow and water quality and increase biodiversity.

The Trees for Survival programme creates community partnerships by engaging schools, their community, local businesses and Councils, working together to restore our natural heritage.

Men's Shed Auckland East works with Trees for Survival by assembling the new shade houses, delivering and installing them into the new Trees for Survival schools in the greater Auckland area.
